

**1.** The marshmallow represents Jesus' body. It is white and pure, just like He was free of sin.

Roll the marshmallow in the melted butter and then in the cinnamon.

**2.** After He died, Jesus' friends put special oils and spices on His body.

Roll the marshmallow in the melted butter and then in the cinnamon sugar mixture.

# Resurrection Rolls



**4.** Jesus' friends looked in the tomb where they had put His body, but they found it was empty! Jesus had risen!

Open a roll to see that the marshmallow has disappeared!

1. Print and cut out tags (cardstock works best for these.)
2. Tie tag #1 around a bag with 8 or more marshmallows.
3. Tie tag #2 around 2 TBSP butter (or a small stick of butter) and a small ziploc bag with 3 TBSP of sugar mixed with 1/2 tsp cinnamon.
4. Attach the "Resurrection Rolls" tag to a bag with a glue stick or double sided tape, or tie it to a bag or basket with a ribbon or twine.
5. Tag #4 can simply be placed into the bag with the rest of the items.

\* If preferred, simply place all items into the bag with the recipe card, instead of attaching tags to each.

**3.** Next, they wrapped His body in special cloth and placed Him in the tomb.

Roll the cinnamon-sugar marshmallow up in a crescent roll (it won't look like a crescent roll). Press all of the seams firmly around it to close any spaces..

Put the rolls on a greased cookie sheet and place into an oven preheated to 350. Let them cook 10-12 minutes until they are browned. The kids can even "guard the tomb" while the rolls cook.



1. Print, cut out, and wrap around the tube of crescent roll dough.
2. Use tape to stick the pink (not flowered) end to the rolls, then wrap around and use double sided tape or a glue stick to attach the flowers.
3. This folds around the tube of rolls easiest if it is printed on paper (not cardstock.)

# Resurrection Rolls

- 1 tube crescent rolls
- 8 large marshmallows
- 2 TBSP butter, melted
